even greater thrill to have been able to speak with them to learn a bit more of what they are about, their view of their culture and heritage and where they want to go in the future.



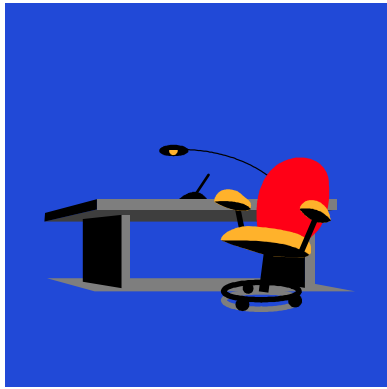
You could watch Nunavimmiut every Tuesday at 11:00 PM and every Wednesday at 10:30 AM, 2:30 PM, and 6:30 PM

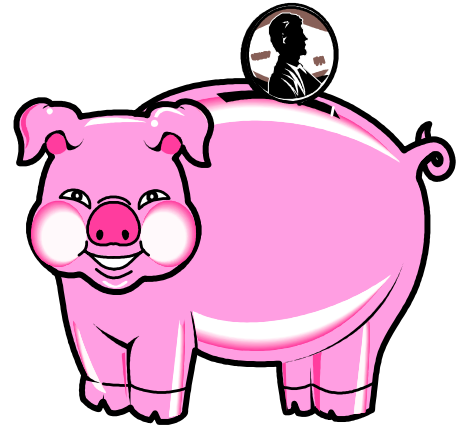
As of November 1st 2005, the TNI office space will be reduced to a small studio where Sandy will continue to work.
