Make sure you tune in to Nunavimuit on APTN this week to watch the Puvirnituaq Snow Festival Part 4: Black Watch/Vent du Nord.

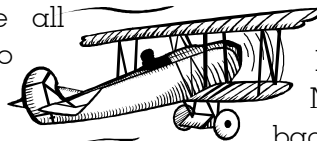
