The first man married a woman from Nova Scotia. He bragged that he had told his wife to do all the dishes and clean the house.

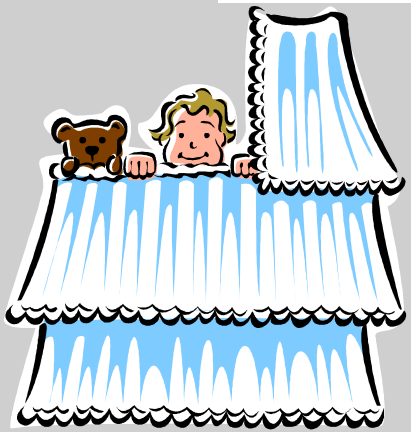
He said that it took her a couple of days, but on the third day he came home to a clean house and the dishes were all washed and put away.
